Selected Small Micro Areas (Adjuntas, Jayuya, Maricao, Santa Isabel, Utuado)

First Semester, 2012

The information in this report refers to the Selected Small Micropolitan Statistical Areas that consists of the municipalities of Adjuntas, Jayuya, Maricao, Santa Isabel and Utuado.

During the first semester, January 2012, the labor force was 30,550. The labor force participation by municipalities are present: Adjuntas 4,900; Jayuya 4,120; Maricao 1,690; Santa Isabel 11,170 and Utuado 8,670.

The average number of Unemployment Insurance during the first semester 2012 in the select small areas are present: Adjuntas 177; Jayuya 108; Maricao 82; Santa Isabel 356 and Utuado 248.

The analysis will guide the generation of labor policies and growth strategy to consolidate a stable economic base fundamental to aspire to better living conditions for the population.



Local Area Unemployment Statistics (LAUS)

A. Civilian Labor Force Trends

The workforce in the small micro areas sectioned average 30,550 people in January, 2012. This implies a participation of 2.4 percent in relation to Puerto Rico. The municipalities of Santa Isabel 11,170 and Utuado 8,670 showed the greatest contribution.



In June 2012, the workforce was represent by 27,910 people, showing a increase of 2,640 participation in the area under study. During this period, Santa Isabel 1,730 growth their workforce.

Last year, small areas formed a labor force of 30,200 people, this represented a increase of 350. The towns of Santa Isabel and Utuado rise 300 and 250, respectively.

B. Employment Trends

The participation of small areas employment during the first semester was 24,590. This represents 2.2 percent of the total number of persons employed in Puerto Rico. Santa Isabel 9,360 and Utuado 6,950 had the largest number of employees within the municipalities that make up the small areas under study.

Analyzing the behavior of six month ago, the small areas under study accounted for 22,530 jobs. This would represent an average increment of 4,506 jobs in the municipalities of reference. Santa Isabel 1,630 is responsible for the gain in employment. Adjuntas 280 and Utuado 240 also contributed to augment jobs. During the period the municipally of Jayuya decreased 160 jobs.

Analyzing a year ago, averaged employment was 24,370. Utuado 250, Santa Isabel 240 and Maricao 10 reflected upward, respectively. While Adjuntas 190 and Jayuya 90, reflected losses.

C. Unemployment Trends


The total number of unemployed persons was estimated at 5,950 on January, 2012. This represents 3.0 percent of the total unemployed in Puerto Rico. The unemployment participation by municipalities are present: Adjuntas 1,140; Jayuya 910; Maricao 380; Santa Isabel 1,800 and Utuado 1,720.

For the month of June, 2012, six month ago, unemployment stood 5,380. During the past six months municipalities of Utuado 200, Jayuya 160, Adjuntas 120 and Santa Isabel 90, respectively increases their unemployment figure. Maricao stayed stable.

D. Unemployment Rate

The scoreboard semester of the economy in the selected small areas gives us the opportunity to take the pulse of our productive order in the area. We recall that the analysis is limited to participants in the labor market.

The unemployment rate in the first semester 2012, exceeded the 16.1. In January, Adjuntas 23.2 had the highest unemployment rate. Other municipalities with high rates were Maricao 22.5 percent and Jayuya 22.1 percent.



Unemployment for last six months ago was 13.9 percent in Puerto Rico, comes to be a rise of 1.4 percent compare with January 2012. Contrary the employment were recorded in Maricao -1.0 and Santa Isabel -2.0 municipalities.

In short, the beginning of 2011, the unemployment rate in the area under study recorded an average of 21.2 percent. The people of Maricao 22.8 and Jayuya 21.5 reflects the largest cup.


The term-insured unemployed is used to defined those individuals receiving unemployment compensation benefits during the week including the 19th of each month.

In the first semester 2012, the number of unemployed claimants average in selected small micro areas was 971. The municipality of Santa Isabel 356 had the highest participation. Highlighting the male gender with 181 claimants. The municipality of Utuaado contribute significantly with 25.5 percent of the beneficiaries of unemployment insurance.

The apportionment by gender group showed that the male registered the largest average figure with 522 a 53.8 percent of the total. In like manner is reflected in the municipalities of the selected small areas.

The average total number of unemployed insurance for the first semester of 2012 in the small micro areas are present: Adjuntas 177; Jayuya 108; Maricao 82; Santa Isabel 356; and Utuaado 248.

The following chart shows the behavior of the genders in the labor market small micro areas. Male participation analyzed shows a higher percentage share in the municipalities of Utuaado 60.1 and Jayuya 58.3 percent.

B. Characteristics of the Insured Unemployed by Age Group

The total claimants in the first half 2012, distribution of the average number of Unemployed Insurance under the age structure reflected in Adjuntas 177; Jayuya 108; Maricao 82; Santa Isabel 356 and Utuado 248.

The distribution of claimants by age group shows highest participation for the ages of 25 to 34 years. The claimants between the ages of 53 to 44 years as the second group. The market mobility in these age groups, increasing claims contrary to the ages of about 55 years to possibly retain more jobs for their experiences.

The previous behavior is repeated in the municipalities under analysis. However, claimants between the ages of 25 to 34 years 34.9 of Jayuya had a significant percentage participation.

This last is evidenced in the next table.



C. Characteristics of the Insured Unemployed by Industry Category

The study of the characteristics of Insured Unemployed in each industrial category shows that selected small micro areas industry largest contribution.

The services employee represented as the industrial sector increased participation unemployed insured. The municipality of Santa Isabel and Utuado with 59 represent respectively significant the largest share. In the case of Utuado the most amount of claimants were in the construction 22 and local government 39.

The chart below shows the extent of industry unemployment claimants. The municipality of Santa Isabel and Utuado on trade with the largest number of claimants by industry. On the contrary, evidence that the industry of utilities and finance, insurance and real estate reflected the least amount of claimants in all the municipalities under study.

D. Characteristics of the Insured Unemployed by Occupational Category

Analysis of the characteristic of the unemployed by occupational category has meaning, it identifies the displace workforce.

Look at those occupations that reported the highest number of claimants for unemployed in selected micro small areas.

The occupation unemployed is a reflection of delicate operation by industry. Farming, Fishing and Forestry occupation formed the largest number of claimants within professional categories studied. The municipality of Santa Isabel had a greater involvement in relation to other municipalities.

A total of 123 production employees were laid off particularly in the municipalities of Adjuntas 35 and Santa Isabel 34.

Just as the occupational categories of office and administrative support 111 point out to economically important impacted significantly in the municipalities of Utuado 36, Santa Isabel 34 and Adjuntas 20.


For each of the three professional groups cited above, the very long term unemployed are concentrated in the industries of construction, trade and education that define the area economic performance.

Identifying what are the characteristics of the insured unemployed in small micro areas design support better systems to protect workers who have become important in recent years, as unemployment has become persistent and has been also in a source of insecurity and social and economic instability among the Puerto Ricans in the area. Thus, the analysis of the characteristics of the unemployed payable on the search for new alternatives to human capital retention of government priorities.

Institutional weaknesses and informality that characterizes the functioning of labor markets in the region, known and widely studied problems are recognized in the reduction of employees in agriculture and construction.

The analysis will guide the generation of industrial policies and growth strategy to consolidate a stable economic base fundamental to aspire to better living conditions for the population.

A. Employment Outlook

The Selected Small Micro Areas will develop some works on the study area.

Utualdo

The municipality of Utualdo projected finish at least four infrastructure projects.

The first is the channeling of the creek "Los Pinos" which is very close to the houses and also avoid pollution damage. Is a project of half a million dollars.

They will pave the main road height. A project of about \$ 280,000.

Improvements Angeles neighborhood elementary school. Build a fitness center, computer area and community center.

At the entrance of the village, building a ballpark. Besides hitting a golf urbanization in Jesus Maria Lugo.

Long-term project will develop green umbrella structure to begin operating in 2014 with 32 homes. This will create some jobs.

Maricao

With an investment of \$600,000 was inaugurated "Judith Seda Matos" electronic library.

Santa Isabel

With an investment of \$1 million the municipality of Santa Isabel farm announced the first hotel of its people.

Will be built in two neighborhoods "Paso Seco Park" and "Playita Cortada" which invested \$2 million.

With an investment of \$1.3 million is being remodeled City Hall house.


Jayuya
