During the second semester, December 2011, the labor force was 29,200. The labor force participation by municipalities are present: Adjuntas (5,000); Jayuya (4,000); Maricao (1,700); Santa Isabel (10,100) and Utuado (8,400).

The number of Unemployment Insurance during the second semester 2012 in the select small areas are present: Adjuntas (264); Jayuya (148); Maricao (73); Santa Isabel (615) and Utuado (267).




A. Civilian Labor Force Trends

The workforce in the small micropolitan statistical area 29,200 people in December, 2011. This implies a participation of 2.3 in relation to Puerto Rico. The municipalities of Santa Isabel (10,100) and Utuado (8,400) showed the greatest contribution.

In June, 2011 the workforce was represented 29,900 people, showing an decrease of 700 participation in the area under study. During this period, Santa Isabel (-300) decreased their workforce. Jayuya and Utuado lost significantly.

Last year the labor force was 27,940 an increase of 1,260 compared to the period under study. The municipality of Santa Isabel (8,800) had the highest participation.



B. Employment Trends

The participation of small micropolitan statistical area employment during the second semester was 24,000. This represents a 2.2 per cent of the total number of persons employed in Puerto Rico. Santa Isabel (8,400) and Utuado (7,000) had the largest number of employees within the municipalities that make up the small area under study.

Analyzing the behavior of six (6) months ago, the small area under study accounted for 24,300 jobs. This would represent an average decrease 300 jobs in the municipalities of reference. Jayuya and Santa Isabel is responsible for the loss in employment. During this period the municipally of Adjuntas and Utuado remained unchanged.

Analyzing a year ago, averaged employment was 22,300. The municipality of Santa Isabel are fully responsible for the increase. Adjuntas and Maricao municipalities in the area increase by 100 jobs..




C. Unemployment Trends

The total number of unemployed persons was estimated at 5,200 on December, 2011. This represents 3.1 percent of the total unemployed in Puerto Rico. The unemployment participation by municipalities are present: Adjuntas (1,000); Jayuya (790); Maricao (320); Santa Isabel (1,700) and Utuado (1,400).

For the month of June, 2011, unemployment stood at 5,700. During the past six (6) months the municipalities of Utuado (-200) reduced significantly in relation to the area. Jayuya and Santa Isabel reduce one hundred (-100) jobs.

Unemployment during the past year shows a reduction of 200 people. The municipalities of Jayuya, Santa Isabel and Utuado reduced 100 unemployed. Puerto Rico reflecting a decrease of 16,700 unemployed in the island.

D. Unemployment Rate



The scoreboard semester of the economy in the selected small area gives us the opportunity to take the pulse of our productive order in the area. We recall that the analysis is limited to participants in the labor market.

In December 2011, the unemployment rate averaged a total of 18.5 percent. The municipalities of Adjuntas, Jayuya and Maricao reflected the higher rates.

Examining six months to a year ago we note a decline in the unemployment rate.

The term-insured unemployed is used to defined those individuals receiving unemployment compensation benefits during the week including the 19th of each month.

In the second semester, 2011 the number of unemployed claimants average in selected small micro area was 1,367. The municipality of Santa Isabel (615) had the highest participation. Highlighting the male gender with 790 claimants. The municipality of Utualdo contribute significantly with 19.5 percent of the beneficiaries of unemployment insurance.

The apportionment by gender group showed that the male registered the largest average figure with 790 a 57.8 percent of the total. In like manner is reflected in the municipalities of the selected small area.

The following chart shows the behavior of the genders in the labor market small micro area.

This section provides information about the characteristics of the insured unemployed by gender in each municipality making up the selected Small Metropolitan Area. The average total number of unemployed insurance for the second semester of 2011 are present: Adjuntas (264); Jayuya (148); Maricao (73); Santa Isabel (615) and Utuado (267).

B. Characteristics of the Insured Unemployed by Age Group

The total claimants in the second half, 2011, distribution of the average number of unemployed insurance under the age structure reflected in Adjuntas (264); Jayuya (148); Maricao (73); Santa Isabel (615) and Utuado (267).

The distribution of claimants by age group shows highest participation for the ages of 25 to 34 years. The claimants between the ages of 35 to 44 years as the second group. The market mobility in these age groups, increasing claims contrary to the ages of about 55 years to possibly retain more jobs for their experience.

This last fact is evidenced in the next table.


C. Characteristics of the Insured Unemployed by Industry Category

The study of the characteristics of Insured Unemployed in each industrial category shows that selected small Micropolitan statistical area industry largest contribution.

The characteristics of the insured unemployed industrial category during the second half of 2012 shows a participation of 1,367.

Most industrial participation refers to the unemployed in the service industry (256). The municipality of Santa Isabel (84) reported the highest participation. Also, Utuado (71) shows a considerable amount of unemployed people in the industry.

Characteristics of the unemployed by occupation show the talents and experiences that our workforce has in view a new opportunity. This semester is indicative of the lack of work in agricultural occupations and production.

In the municipality of Santa Isabel occupations of farming, forestry and fishing accounted for 44.0 percent of unemployment insurance claimants. On the other hand, Maricao Municipality shows a participation of 26.0 percent of production claims.

III. Employment and Unemployment outlook

A. Employment outlook

The prospects for employment are positive thanks to local governments in selected small micropolitan statistical area.

Utuada

In the municipality of Utuada mentioned the integration of efforts of the Department of Agriculture, the Energy Affairs Administration and Finance Authority and Infrastructure (AFI) to reduce operating costs in the agricultural sector. They undertake a renewable energy project at a cost of \$ 241,000. The hydroponic agribusiness products began to operate with 147 photo voltaic panels and 5 investor.

Another project highlighted in the municipality of Utuada is the rehabilitation of urban areas. Among the works for this purpose is the Museum of History, a boutique hotel of 14 to 16 rooms. Among the rehabilitation is contemplated channeling of the creek, "Los Pinos". It also acquired the Los Angeles school to rehabilitate and convert it into a community center with recreational area and computer center.

Jayuya

The municipal administration began an initiative in Jayuya with an investment of \$ 1 million dollars for housing projects of social interest. The purpose is to offer a loan up to \$ 50,000 dollars to buy a home, funded by 3 per cent interest. The customer will have to contribute only with \$ 200 dollars.

Another project is an athletic track with an investment of \$ 6 million. This will count with 6 lanes, prepared for the realization of all types of track and field event.

There are works of improvements to the lighting with an investment of \$ 1 million.

It also builds community center in "Guillarte" at a cost of \$ 200 thousand dollar.

For its part the Authority to finance housing apartments turn over the Alto del Rio at a price of \$ 90.000 dollars.



Maricao

The municipal administration of Maricao inaugurate 12 apartments of social interest.

Other projects include athletic track, water park and new headquarters city with an investment of \$ 1 million.

Among the projects are building a new small park in the town league with an investment of \$ 1 million. In the facilities of the park there will be a cafeteria, transmission booth and bleachers for 700 spectators.

Santa Isabel



The municipality of Santa Isabel develops a wind energy project, it requires a \$ 250 million inversion. This project will benefit 25,000 families. Development is done with private funds.

B. Unemployment Outlook

The future unemployment level showed minimal loss as a result of jobs created by activities previously mentioned.
